I hope you are inspired by our program and our speakers!



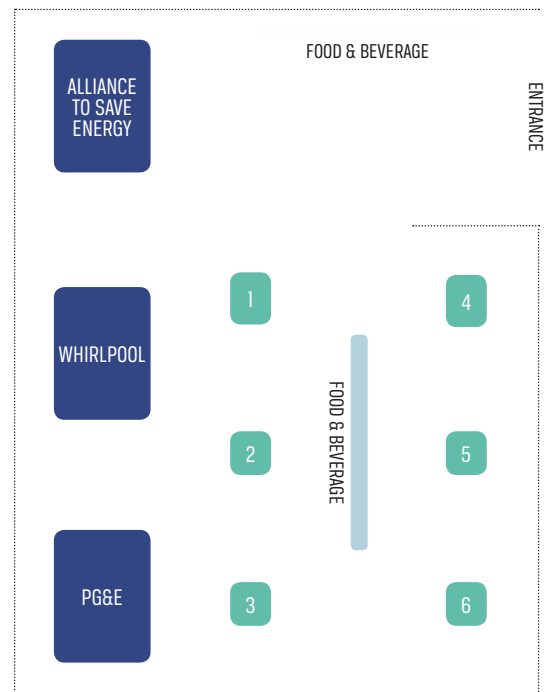

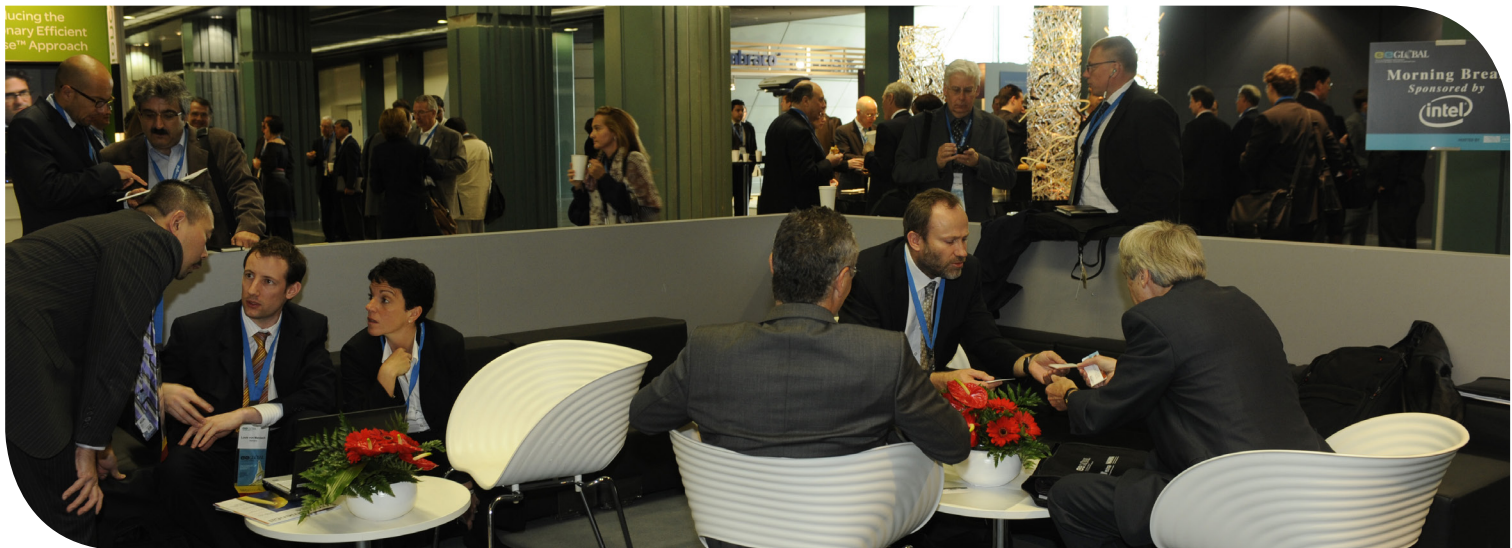

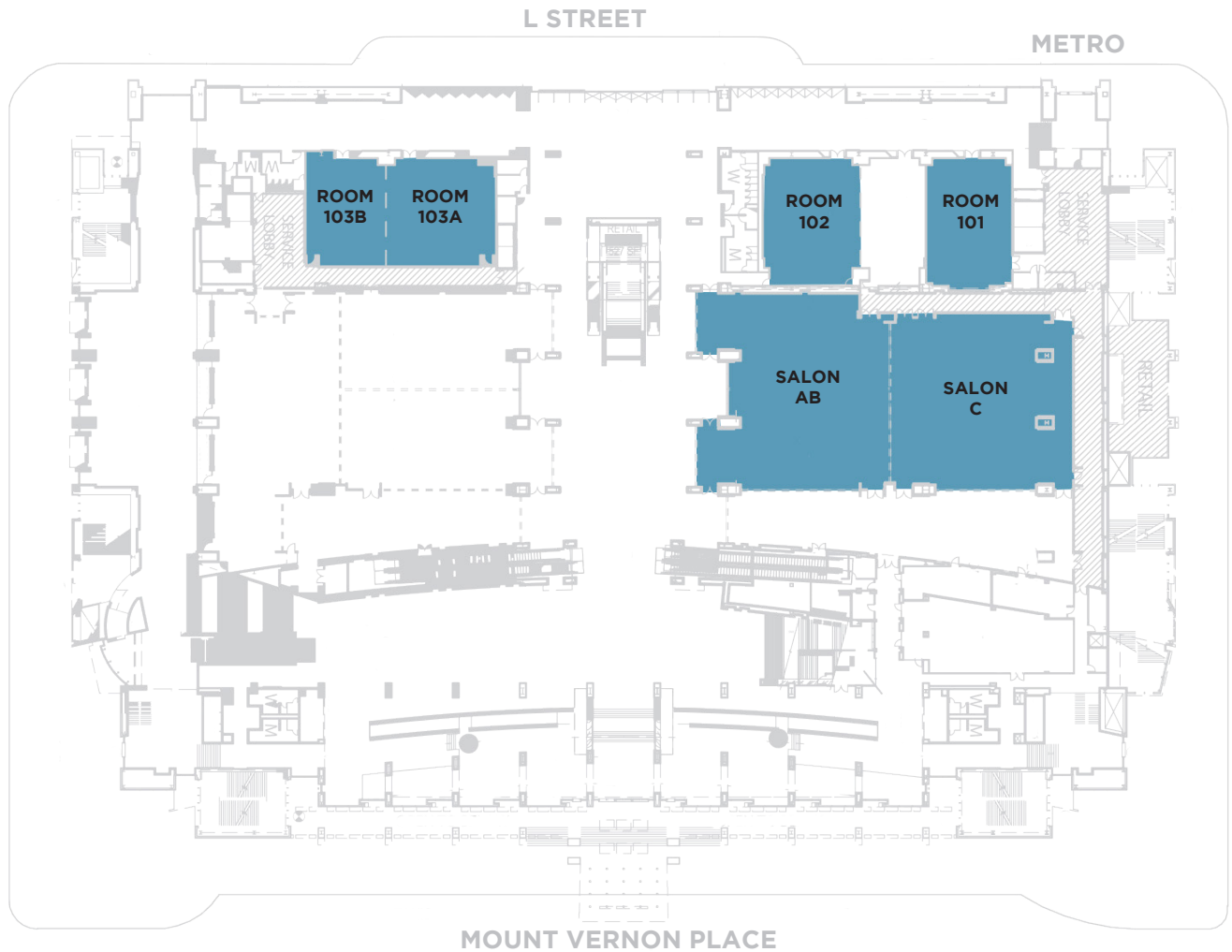
